Ronita is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines.

Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partner in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ, Ronita was able to re-enrol in her studies and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child.

After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre and is looking to a brighter future for her whole family.

"I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself," she said "I feel hopeful for the future... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you."

This year our school is focusing on implementing a Science of Reading approach to literacy. This approach is based on a vast body of research from cognitive science, linguistics, psychology, education and neurology exploring the process of how children learn to read.

To enable our teachers to best support our students we have implemented a new literacy assessment called DIBELS. This assessment is designed to help teachers and schools determine how students are performing on important reading skills. DIBELS stands for Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills.

DIBELS includes a range of 1-3 minute tests that are administered individually. Theses tests assess phonemic awareness, phonics, reading fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.

Students from Foundation through to year 6 will participate in the assessment 3 times per year. The data collected will then be used by teachers to forward plan for the next term, identify individual reading goals and create targeted interventions for students requiring additional support.

Kitchen Garden/Science



A huge thank you to all of the families who volunteered their time over the Summer holidays to help our Kitchen Garden flourish. As a result we have been excitedly watching fruit and vegetables such as zucchini, beans and cucumbers mature and ripen over the last few weeks. Many students expressed surprise at how much they enjoyed eating the raw beans!



This week students in 3/4 harvested coriander seeds from our garden as they consolidated their understanding of the lifecycle of a flowering plant. Using a mortar and pestle the 3/4 students used their harvested coriander seeds to make delicious nut free dukkah. We look forward to cooking with our ripening tomatoes and zucchinis in the coming weeks!



Our budding entomologists in F/1 went in search of the yellow ladybugs inhabiting our zucchinis plants this week. With magnifying glasses in hand they were able to find examples of every stage of the life cycle; the eggs, larvae, pupa and adult yellow lady bugs!



We are very excited to announce the upcoming whole school excursion to the Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show on Friday 22nd March. Students will learn from expert horticulturalists and agricultural entomologists and also take part in interactive presentations, workshops and educational garden activities.
