Principal's Message

Dear Families,

We've had a fantastic start to the school year, with new students and families settling in smoothly. Teachers are focusing on establishing school and classroom routines to set high expectations, ensure full participation, and foster deep engagement in learning. Students have already begun working hard in Literacy and Numeracy, using evidence-based strategies to support their learning. Thank you for your efforts in making this a great start!

A huge thank you to all the families who attended the Parent Information Sessions and Welcome BBQ. It was wonderful to see everyone and catch up. Your presence and engagement help strengthen our school community.

Spelling Mastery: Following our teacher training on the first day, students in Years 3-6 have now been introduced to the Spelling Mastery Program, an explicit and structured approach to spelling. They have completed a pre-assessment to determine their level and have been assigned a workbook. Teachers guide them through the lessons to help them build mastery, strengthen retention, and develop confidence in spelling.

Ask your child about "Chin it" and "Bin it"—two simple but powerful strategies we use to support active participation and learning. These approaches help students to engage with their thinking, reflect on their responses, and ensure they are making the most of every learning opportunity.

This Wednesday, we will gather for our Beginning of Year Mass and to mark Ash Wednesday at 2:15 pm in the church. During the Mass, our Year 6 students will be introduced to the community and receive their badges. We look forward to witnessing their leadership and responsibility in action this year.

MHIPS - Mental Health in Primary Schools

Hi Everyone,

I hope you all had a fantastic break over the Summer. I have just come back from Long Service Leave where I had the opportunity to go overseas and reconnect with my parent's homeland of Malta, but it's wonderful to be back here at St Monica's for another year.

I continue in my role as Mental Health Leader this year, supporting students and staff in looking after their own mental health and wellbeing.

I will be offering the Peaceful Kids Program again in Term 2. This is a positive psychology program that helps children manage their anxiety and introduces strategies such as mindfulness and helps to build their emotional resilience. Children are selected for this program by the child's classroom teacher and the Wellbeing Leader.



I have qualified in Initiatic Art Therapy and Clay Field Therapy for children. Art Therapy supports children in regulating their nervous system and helps them to release trauma and tension that they may carry in their bodies.

I will be supporting individual students using Initiatic Art Therapy and Clay Field Therapy. This will be introduced later in the year.

I am at St Monica's every Tuesday if you ever need to get in touch with me or just want to say 'Hi'.


Maths

Last week, as part of our **Family Information Session**, you would have received your child's **Mathletics login details**. We have invested in subscriptions for all our students because we believe it is an excellent tool for continuing learning at home.

Your child's 'To Do' list is updated regularly based on their learning in class. A key takeaway from the information below is that a score of 85% or above (green) is an indication that your child has demonstrated confidence in that particular skill. A score between 50 and 84% (orange) indicates they need a little extra practice and a score of less than 50% (red) means they will need a bit of help.

If you believe the 'To Do' list does not accurately reflect your child's ability please let your child's classroom teacher know.

The new courses aligned with the new Australian Curriculum V9, and new NSW Syllabus enables students to systematically build their knowledge and skills. The journey to fluency, reasoning and problemsolving starts with explaining new concepts clearly, followed by demonstration and well-written, well-sequenced practice questions. The new question sets are scaffolded with 5 Fluency, 3 Reasoning and 2 Problem-Solving questions.

The Games section offers a range of engaging mathematical games, including Multiverse and Rainforest Maths.

Students can also visit Meritopia. It's an engaging student reward area. Students can unlock and explore this interactive, open world game once they earn points for completing activities.

Live Mathletics

Students practice their mathematical fluency. In Live Mathletics, learners can challenge each other to a real-time 60-second race that tests their speed and accuracy. By playing in the Live Mathletics widget, students can also earn M Coins.

Student Console

The **Student** Console displays each student's statistics, including points earned, questions answered, sets completed and gold bars earned. This tracks each student's progress and their accomplishments.

Students design and customize their avatars using M Coins, earned by completing educator-assigned activities, and self-directed challenges.

My Awards

Students can celebrate their hard work with personalized certificates tied to new Achievement Levels. Ranging from Bronze to Legend, these reflect how often a student has earned 1000 points per week.

Points This Week

This fun and engaging widget showcases how many points students have earned on a weekly basis. With every 100 points earned, a new surprise appears.

Mathletics Rewards and Recognition





Mathletics understands the importance of keeping your child motivated and engaged.

Motivating your child to use mathletics is easier than ever. Some students are motivated by avatar customisations, and some are motivated by how may question sets they complete throughout the year.


Students can easily see their metrics right on their student console.

Points: Students are awarded points for every correct answer they give in Mathletics curriculum activities and Live Mathletics. The student's weekly points score is displayed at the top of the student console. When a student has earned 1000 points in a single week they are awarded a certificate.



My points

Students can see how many questions they complete in an academic year, how many points they have earned and how many M Coins they have accumulated. M Coins do not reset per week.



School Saving Bonus (SSB)

The School Saving Bonus recently seen in the media is \$400 of additional support for families who qualify for CSEF funding in 2025. To ensure this is distributed correctly SMF encourage eligible families to submit their CSEF/concessions 2025 application as soon as possible in Term 1 2025. This will be applied to your Student levy and/or camp payment to cover the cost of camps, excursions and school based activities. MACS Schools cannot provide this SSB to families in a way of cash, vouchers or reimbursement.

Any family who is experiencing difficulties in meeting their financial commitments or wishing to discuss alternate fee payment arrangements for 2025, is asked to arrange an appointment with Andrea Wilberger Acting (Principal - 2025). In line with the MACS Concessional Fee Policy, discounted fees are available for families experiencing financial difficulty (including those on an eligible HCC).

Fee Concessions/Remissions

St Monica's School provides fee remissions/concessions to families in need, including families who are:

- of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage
- holds a HCC and is eligible for CSEF
- experiencing severe financial hardship
- holds a DVA Gold Card
- identified as refuges and holding an ImmiCard
- HSS who attend a MACS primary school on a part time basis, who meet any of the criteria detailed above.

Applications for concessional school fees must be made on the St Monica's school fees approved concession program form, which can be provided upon request. Information provided in support of concessional school fees will be treated in the strictest confidence, in accordance with the School's Privacy Policy. For approved applications for concessional fees, an automated payment plan will be established by direct debit/credit to the school.


